Laura R. Ellsworth served as a Forensic Services Technician for the Baltimore County Police (Maryland) Crime Laboratory, and has taught academic courses for over twelve years in criminal justice, criminal investigation, criminal law, criminalistics and forensic sciences.

During the past ten years at Prince George's Community College, she has also created programs, written curriculum, presented workshops, and taught and provided in-service training components for the Prince George's County Municipal Police Academy. She has served as the Chairperson for her department since 2006. In 2008, she was nominated by her peers and received the Faculty Senate Excellence Award on the basis of demonstrated outstanding service to students, to the college, and within her discipline.
