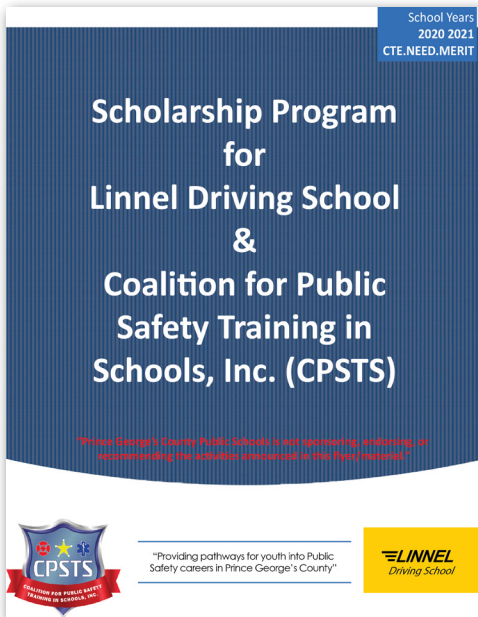


Welcoming Scholarship Recipients to Class April 3, 2022, Landover, Maryland

Taylor, Founder/Executive Director of the Coalition for Public Safety Training in Schools, Inc. (CPSTS) to kick off the April 3, 2022, Driver Education class. The April 3rd class is conducted virtually as the result of continued COVID-19 protocols.

Sixty area high school students were selected to receive full scholarships to attend this 10 week, 30-hour training program. Those who successfully complete the program will be closer to completing the requirements to obtain a Provisional License issued by the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA).

A license can make all the difference between gainful employment and sustainable employment. Many of the students have come to recognize that personal vehicle ownership is not a requirement for lucrative employment; businesses such as Comcast, Verizon, Amazon, and the US Postal Service supply work vehicles to their employees.
